

Ghaub Nature Reserve & Farm

The 192 km² area of Ghaub comprises a nature reserve with a limestone cave and a farm engaged in livestock breeding and the cultivation of crops and vegetables. Ghaub is home to a unique flora, boasting more than 250 bird species, as well as game species such as white rhino, giraffe, eland, zebra, impala, red hartebeest, and blesbok.





Strong partnership for nature conservation



Ghaub is a partner of **ONE Namibia**, a company that integrates tourism, agriculture, and nature conservation. This involves maintaining wildlife, preserving their natural habitats, boosting local agriculture production, providing tourists with a nature-based experience, funding conservation efforts through hospitality, and generating employment.

Your experiences at Ghaub



Rhino Drive (16h00, 2-3 hours)

Round trip through the African bush savannah in the Otavi Mountains.

A charming contrast to Etosha: The mountainous area of our nature reserve is home to game such as giraffe, zebra, eland, impala and red hartebeest. We almost always encounter white rhinos.



Rhino Tracking (8h00, 2-3 hours, fitness is a must)

Accompany the trackers of our "Rhino Patrol" on foot in their search of the white rhinos.

You will learn about the challenges faced in protecting these animals. With a little luck, you will also encounter the rhinos – at eye level.

Pre-bookings for experiences are only available for guests staying two nights or more. Guests staying for one night can only book on-site, subject to availability. Please note that children cannot participate in activities without their parents.

To protect the rhinos and other game from poachers, we have implemented a game fence, guarded gates on the thoroughfares, and a 'Rhino Patrol' that tracks the rhinos daily and informs our guides.



Cave Excursion (8h00, 2-3 hours)

Not for claustrophobic quests! Fitness is a must: The deeper in the cave, the lesser oxygen in the air. With its 2.5 km long system of passages the limestone cave of Ghaub is the third largest cave in Namibia.

As we have to crawl here and there, please wear sturdy clothes and shoes. Helmet and headlamp are provided. Ride to the cave (4.5 km) in your car.



Nature Trails (easy to moderately difficult)

Farm roads lead you through the mountain paradise of Ghaub with over 250 bird species. A cemetery and a stone pulpit are historical reminders of a small missionary parish and the last fights during World War One in Southwest Africa. Don't miss the view from the "Lion King" rock.

We recommend sturdy shoes, a hat and a bottle of water.



Farm tour (minimum 10 p., booking 7 days in advance; 8h00, 2-3 hours)

Agriculture in Namibia? Indeed! Since it is raining well in this region and there is plenty of groundwater, we at Ghaub do not only raise cattle, but also grow crops and vegetables.

The tour is guided by the farmer and provides fascinating insights into an extraordinary farming operation.



Your accommodation at Ghaub

Lodge: Rustic farm walls, tall palm trees and a lush lawn surround the lovingly restored historic buildings of the former Mission Station (1895). The restaurant with bar and terrace offers free WLAN (limited bandwidth). The large swimming pool is surrounded by an extensive garden.

Meals: Breakfast, lunch snack on request, dinner: set menu (farm cuisine with hearty dishes).



Ghaub Lodge (12 double rooms)

The spacious twin bed rooms with ceiling fan have a terrace and lounge with coffee station & mini bar.





Campsite: Each pitch has a shade roof, table, bench, barbecue, sink, tap, power point and own shower / toilet. Free WLAN (limited bandwidth) in the lodge restaurant (3 min. walk).

Please be prepared for **self-catering**: No meals available in the restaurant when the lodge is fully booked.



Ghaub Campsite (3 pitches) - Located on the slope of a hill, overlooking a wide valley in the Otavi Mountains.

The three pitches are separated by bush and rocks.





Fresh farm produce (varying seasonally)

Enjoy fresh fruits and vegetables as well as meat from free-range cattle, supplied by our farming operation.

Under the label **Ghaub Farm Products** we produce a variety of products like jams, juices, oils and firewood.



The vegetables are **naturally grown**. Our water is rich in minerals and the soil is naturally fertilized with cow dung and hay.
